15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

a) **SCMIRT: A Hub for Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education** SCMIRT (Suryadatta Institute of Management Information Research and Technology) was established to enhance students' careers and foster holistic development. It is dedicated to transforming aspirations into reality by functioning as a multidisciplinary educational hub, offering a diverse range of programs. Academic Programs The institute provides undergraduate and postgraduate programs across various disciplines: Commerce: Courses such as B.Com, BBA, BBA-IB, BBA-CA, and M.Com. Science: Programs in Information Technology, Computer Science, Animation, M.Sc. in Computer Science, and M.Sc. in Data Science. Arts: A Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree program. To ensure students' all-round development, SCMIRT incorporates Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) into its curriculum across all fields. b) **Integration of Humanities and Sciences with STEM** SCMIRT promotes an integrated approach, blending humanities with STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics). It offers courses like Human Rights, Physical Education, Environmental Awareness, Language Communication Skills, and Gender Equality. These courses aim to enhance communication skills, foster empathy, promote social justice, and enable critical thinking. The integration is reinforced through co-curricular and extracurricular activities. c) **Flexible and Innovative Curriculum** The institute follows a dynamic curriculum aligned with S.P.P.U. and NEP 2020 guidelines. Students earn additional credits through online platforms, short-term courses, internships, research papers, industrial visits, NSS activities, sports, and cultural events. NSS activities promote social contribution, while courses like Environmental Studies create awareness about sustainability. Flexible program structures allow multiple entry and exit points. Students receive a certificate after one year, a diploma after two years, a degree after three years, and an honors degree after four years. Admissions are also open to students from other universities, subject to S.P.P.U. equivalence processes. d) The institution has adopted a flexible and innovative structure aligned with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, allowing multiple entry and exit points in its programs. Students completing one year of degree given Certificate, student completing two years are given Diploma certificate, three years completion is giving degree and four year

completion is offering honours degree. Admissions are also open to students from other universities, subject to the equivalence process approved by S.P.P.U. e) Promoting Multidisciplinary Research SCMIRT encourages students and faculty to engage in multidisciplinary research to address societal challenges. Students are supported in writing research papers and conducting surveys to find innovative solutions to pressing social issues. f) Good Practices in Multidisciplinary and Interdisciplinary Learning SCMIRT integrates multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary practices in its educational offerings: Multidisciplinary Programs: For example, the B.Com program includes diverse subjects like Law, Computer Science, Yoga, Physical Education, and Environmental Awareness. Interdisciplinary Courses: Short-term courses like Soft Skills, German Language, Human Rights, and Cyber Security are open to students from Science, Commerce, and Arts streams. SCMIRT continues to innovate and expand its offerings, equipping students with the skills and knowledge to address complex real-world problems. Its holistic, flexible, and interdisciplinary approach aligns with the goals of NEP 2020, ensuring that education remains relevant and transformative.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The college has implemented the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) system in line with the guidelines issued by the Digital India Corporation, University Grants Commission (UGC), and Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU). Students were guided through the process, including a demonstration for creating their ABC ID (now known as APAAR). All students successfully created their ABC IDs and uploaded them on the university's official website.

The college is dedicated to fostering these skills to enhance students' employability. To further enhance skills, the college regularly conducts industry expert sessions. All third-year undergraduate students are required to complete a compulsory internship, which provides hands-on experience and practical learning. Students also have the opportunity to participate in-house internships offered by the Suryadatta Group of Institutions. As part of their final year requirements, students must earn an additional 8 credits through activities such as short-term courses, online certifications, internships, and research paper writing for further enriching their skill sets. A notable practice at the institution is the provision of paid in-house internships, which serve as vocational training. These internships prepare students with various professional skills, including Marketing, Research, Cash Handling, Accounting, Counseling, Public Relations (PRO), Advanced Excel, Tally, and more. To nurture human values and ethics, the college offers dedicated courses on value education and regularly invites eminent personalities from diverse fields such as social work, politics, the armed forces, and industry. These guest lectures emphasize values like social responsibility, mannerisms, ethical behavior, and active citizenship, ensuring students develop into well-rounded individuals.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The institution is committed to the holistic development of students, emphasizing the promotion of the Indian Knowledge System. As part of this effort, the institution offers Hindi and English language courses in undergraduate programs. Additionally, language proficiency in regional and national languages, along with English, is a criterion for faculty recruitment. Although the medium of instruction and examination is English, faculty members are encouraged to use Marathi and Hindi to make the teaching-learning process more effective. Students also have the option to write their examination papers in Hindi or Marathi if selected in their exam forms. To foster Indian languages, the college celebrates Marathi Bhasha Divas and Hindi Bhasha Divas, organizing activities such as book exhibitions and language quizzes to promote these languages.

The institution also celebrates Indian culture through festivals like Ganesh Chaturthi, Navratri, Diwali, and Sankranti on campus. Yoga is an integral part of the institution's activities, with regular training sessions provided by a dedicated Yoga faculty. A unique initiative, of celebrating International Yoga day , 'Suryadatta Sddhamantra Hasya Curative Yogathon' on 21 June 2024 was done under Yogacharya Savita Gandhi..The institution also invites music and performing artists to showcase their talents, further enriching the cultural experience on campus and fostering an appreciation for Indian art and heritage. These initiatives reflect the institution's dedication to promoting Indian culture, language, and holistic growth among students and staff.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

i. As part of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) guidelines, the university has restructured the syllabi for all programs, incorporating course and program outcomes as objectives. These outcomes are discussed with students at the end of the academic year and verified through various attainment methods. Institutional Initiatives for Curriculum Transformation to OBE The college adopted the CBCS system implemented by Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU) in the academic year 2013-14 for postgraduate programs and in 2019 for all undergraduate programs. The CBCS framework ensures continuous evaluation and a transparent assessment system, aligning with the principles of Outcome-Based Education (OBE). ii. Efforts to Implement OBE in Teaching and Learning Practices Under CBCS, the college conducts continuous assessments using the Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) system, aimed at improving evaluation practices. The Centralized Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system forms the foundation of this approach, ensuring holistic and ongoing assessment of students throughout the academic year. Key elements of the CIE system include: Preparation and publication of an academic calendar detailing internal evaluation schedules. Regular assessments such as class tests, practical journal reviews, presentations, home assignments, open book tests, case studies, role plays, poster-making activities, and policy design exercises. A transparent evaluation process that monitors students' academic progress and provides actionable feedback for teachers and parents. The CIE system enables timely result declaration, effective tracking of academic outcomes, and consistent performance improvement for both students and faculty. iii. Good Practices Aligned with NEP 2020 and OBE To enhance learning and align with NEP 2020, the institution follows blended teaching methods: Digital Platforms for Teaching and Learning: Google Classrooms and Whats app groups are created , where study materials are uploaded for easy accessibility. Online

platforms are used for assignments, tests, presentations, and examinations to make learning convenient. Interactive Learning Opportunities: Departments regularly organize webinars and events such as poster-making, project presentations, internships, business games, business quizzes, academic quizzes and debates, integrating Information Communication Tools (ICT) to foster engagement and creativity. These initiatives reflect the college's commitment to fostering a student-centered, outcome-based educational environment that prioritizes skill development, innovation, and academic excellence.

20.Distance education/online education:

a) The possibilities of offering vocational courses through ODL mode in the institution. The introduction of vocational courses through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) in undergraduate institutions affiliated with Savitribai Phule Pune University (SPPU) can create diverse opportunities for skill development, employability, and lifelong learning. The flexibility and accessibility of the ODL model make it a promising avenue for integrating vocational education into the curriculum. Faculty wise vocational courses can be developed by expert and experienced faculties in association with Industry partners. ICT tools and techniques such as LMS, Webinars, virtual labs, simulations, google classroom etc. shall be used effectively in conduction of such courses. It will play key roll in interdisciplinary education , skill enhancement and for bringing academic flexibility. Courses like AI Tools, Stock Markets Trading, Digital Marketing, Foreign languages ,Basic course in Financial Management etc. can be launched by the institution in online and distance learning mode. Implementing vocational courses through ODL in undergraduate institutions under SPPU is a transformative step towards making education inclusive, skill-oriented, and aligned with National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. By addressing challenges and leveraging technology, the ODL model can empower students with practical skills, contributing to their personal growth and national workforce development. b) The development and use of technological tools for teaching learning activities. The details about the institutional efforts towards the blended learning. SCMIRT has embraced technological tools to transform teaching and learning processes, making education more accessible, engaging, and effective. Below are some of the key ways in which technological tools are utilized: 1. Virtual Classrooms and Video Conferencing Tools Tools like Zoom, Microsoft Teams, and Google Meet are used for conducting online sessions, guest sessions, short term courses and webinars.. 2. Digital Content Creation and Sharing Course wise notes, videos are created and shared with students for effective

teaching learning 3. Online Courses such as Swayam,NPTEL, MSBVE availability Students are exposed to open online courses such as Swayam,NPTEL, MSBVE Students are given extra credits on completion of these course. 4. Smart Boards, LCD screens availability in classroom has made classroom teaching interesting and effective. By integrating these technologies our educational institution is not only improving the quality of teaching-learning processes but also preparing students to thrive in a technology-driven world. - Good practices of the institution pertaining to the Distance education/online education in view of NEP 2020. College is exposing students with various online courses available on SWAYAM,MSBVE,NPTEL and other reliable on line courses. Students are offered various webinars , workshops, industry guest sessions, softskill sessions etc .from time to time. Online short term courses are also offered by institution on regular basis. Recently, college has offered distance education by offering YCMOU Graduate and post graduate programmes.
